

SIGN LOCATION

The Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) defines the placement and installation of signs within the Clinical Center (CC) as follows:

MOUNTING LOCATIONS

Signs permanently designating rooms and spaces must be mounted on the wall adjacent to the latch side of the door, 60 inches from the centerline of the sign to the floor. In case of obstructions, mount on the wall surface nearest to the latch side of the door and positioned to avoid door swing and protruding objects. In an instance where doors are located so that proper mounting is not feasible, exceptions may be granted by the OFM. Examples of such:

- Glass panels adjacent to the latch side of the door.
- Doors with no adjacent wall surface on the latch side of the door.
- Doors with no adjacent wall surface clear of door swing.
- Oversize signs.
