Supervisory Clinical Nurse GS-13 (Medical Oncology) Nurse Manager, 3SE-N Medical Oncology

This supervisory nursing leadership position is located at the National Institutes of Health (NIH), Clinical Center (CC), in the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). The position reports directly to the Service Chief for Oncology and Critical Care and serves organizationally as the Nurse Manager for the Medical Oncology program of care, overseeing clinical research nursing services for the medical oncology inpatient unit.

The CC leads the nation in implementing a specialty practice model for Clinical Research Nursing which defines the roles and contribution of nurses providing care to research participants. The medical oncology program at the NIH conducts clinical research designed to improve patient outcomes developing, testing and translating innovative treatments for lymphoma, multiple myelomas and HIV.
