Doctors at the National Institutes of Health (NIH) are investigating what happens in kids' immune systems after receiving a flu vaccine. They are enrolling children who will be receiving the seasonal flu vaccine. There is no charge to participate in the research study. You will be compensated for your time, inconvenience, and participation in the research study.

Who can participate?

- Children 2 to 17 years of age at time of Enrollment
- Children with plans to receive the current seasonal flu vaccine by injection
- Willing to obtain at-home micro-blood and nasal sample collections
- Willing to have blood and nasal samples stored for future research

What does the study involve?

- Telephone consent
- Telephone calls to review medical history
- Three home micro-blood sample and four nasal sample collections
- Complete an electronic questionnaire after Vaccination
- Approximately 6 months long
