

Recruiting cancer patients for COVID19 VACCINE study

Researchers want to explore how well cancer patients respond to the vaccine.

Study involves:

- Physical exam and blood testing
- Two COVID-19 vaccines
- Multiple visits over a 13 month period at the NIH Clinical Center, Bethesda, MD



ARE YOU CURRENTLY BEING TREATED FOR CANCER?

NIH has a study offering the Moderna COVID19 vaccine for cancer patients who are either currently receiving immune-based treatment for cancer OR patients who have a blood cancer who are receiving treatment now from their doctor, and who have not yet received the COVID19 vaccine or been infected with the virus that causes COVID19.



You may be eligible if you:

- Are at least 18 years old
- Have cancer and are *either* receiving immunotherapy *or* are being treated for a blood cancer
- Have *NOT* yet received the COVID-19 vaccine
- Have no history of coronavirus
